The first Pride event was organised by <u>Brenda Howard</u>, a bisexual activist, in New York City on the 28th of June 1970. Called the Christopher Street Liberation Day March (which is the name of the road the Stonewall Inn is on), the event had both an element of celebration and protest. Pride parades were soon established all over the world, and this year, the <u>Pride in London</u> parade will celebrate 50 years since its first march took place in 1972.

In order to celebrate Pride fully, it is important to learn about and remember those who fought for the right to celebrate. The history of the Pride movement also reminds us about how, in the past, and unfortunately sometimes still today, LGBTQ+ people are not able to express themselves safely. Thus, the joy found at Pride events across the globe is in itself 'an act of resistance' and can give power and strength to those campaigning to bring about positive change for the LGBTQ+ community.
